

# Why Spiders Have Eight Skinny Legs


What happens when you want too much

Anansi's wife was a good cook, but Anansi was greedy. He loved going to his friends' houses to see what they were eating. He liked to taste the food that others in the village made.

One day, Anansi stopped by Rabbit's house. 10 "There are *greens* cooking in your pot," said Anansi. "The greens aren't done," said Rabbit. "They need to cook longer. Would you like to stay and eat?"



"I would love to," said Anansi. "But I have things to do." He knew that if he stayed that Rabbit would give him work to do. Anansi was lazy. "I know what I will do," said Anansi. "I will *spin* a *web* and tie it to my leg. When the greens are done, pull on the web, and I'll come back as fast as I can."



"Join me. They'll be done soon," called Hog. Anansi licked his lips and again suggested he tie a web to his leg. He handed Hog the other end.



Anansi was *proceeding* toward Rabbit's house when he felt a pull from the Monkeys' house. He stopped. "Greens or beans? Which should I eat first?" Then he felt a third pull and a fourth. Then came a fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth.

Anansi felt a *tug* at his leg. Anansi said, "That is the web string tied to Rabbit's greens." He

## Usage Tip


"Come join us," called the Monkeys. (p. 19, line 3)

Anansi had sore legs for a long time. "Being greedy is not a good idea after all," thought 10 Anansi.

Today, all spiders still have eight long, skinny legs to remind them to control their greed. ♥
